NEW- Exams. One midterm in-class exam was given in class prior to March 6, 2020, and the remaining midterm exam and the final assessment will have an online part, as well as a written part. The date for the midterm exam will be announced at least one week prior to the exam. The final assessment will be given online on Tuesday, May 5 from 2:00 PM to 3:15 PM. Online timed quizzes may be given on selected days.

NEW- Homework. Homework will be assigned weekly and will usually be due online on Thursday. *No late homework will be accepted!* I will also suggest you attempt a number of other problems in each section, which you need not turn in.

NEW- Grading. Attendance of lectures will be taken in ZOOM starting on March 23, 2020. Your grade will be based on your scores on homework and quizzes (25 %), your best midterm exam (25 %), your worst midterm (20 %) and the final assessment (30 %).

An overall score of at least 90% will receive an A, a score of at least 80% will guarantee a B, a score of at least 70% will guarantee a C, while getting at least 60% will ensure passing. Depending on the score distribution, these cutoffs may be lowered. Some discretion may be used in deciding borderline cases.

Topics to be covered. This semester we will cover parts of chapters 1-6 of the text.
